Quantity expressions

a) Countable and uncountable nouns
Some nouns are countable (door, pen, book, table) and others are uncountable (onformation, paper, equipment)

- 1. We can use countable nouns in the singular an indefinite article (a door) an also in the plural (two doors, three pens, some books).
- We can't use uncountable nouns with the indefinite article or in the plural (some information, some water) (not an information, a water)

Quantity expressions Some, any

We use <u>some</u> and <u>any</u> to talk about quantity, but not a particular quantity.

a). We use **<u>some</u>** in positive sentences with

uncountable nouns:

I need <u>some</u> information

I want some water

And plural countable nouns

I need <u>some</u> collegues here today

We want **<u>some</u>** chairs taken to the meeting room.

Quantity expressions Some, any

- B We also use some for requests, Questions and offers when we expect the answer "YES".
- A: Would you like some water?
- B: Yes I`d love some.
- A: Can I Have some paper? B: Of course you can.

Quantity expressions Some, any

c) We use any with plural countable nouns and uncountable nouns for <u>questions</u> when we do not know the answer and for <u>negative</u> sentences.

Have you got any brothers or sisters?Have you got any questions?I don`t need any potatoesI didn't buy any wine.

Quantity expressions A few-a little

We use <u>a few</u> and <u>a little</u> to talk about a *small* quantity.

a) We use <u>a few</u> with <u>countable</u> nouns in questions and positive sentences .

I need a few apples. Can I have a few tomatoes?

Quantity expressions A few-a little

b). We use <u>a little</u> with <u>uncountable</u> nouns in questions and positive sentences.

They want a little water

I can give you a little coffee

Can I Have a little butter?

Quantity expressions A lot (of) , much, many We use <u>a lot (of) much</u> and <u>many</u> to talk about <u>large</u>

quantity

- a). We use a lot (of) with <u>countable</u> and <u>uncountable</u> nouns in positive and negative sentences and questions
- I am doing <u>a lot of</u> work at the moment
- Have you got <u>a lot of</u> books?
- I have got a lot of money. But not <u>a lot.</u>

Quantity expressions A lot (of), much, many

We use <u>Much</u> with uncountable nouns in negative sentences and questions.

I didn't have much time.

How much time did you need? Not much

Quantity expressions A lot (of) , much, many

c). We use <u>many</u> with countable nouns in negative sentences and questions.

We haven't got <u>many</u> sunny days.

How many students are there? Not many

We don't usually use much in positive. In informal English, many is not common in positive sentences. We prefer a lot (of)
